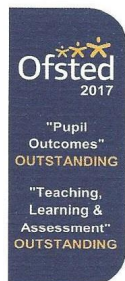

Examination results for Key Stage 1 & 2, G.C.S.E. and 'A' level Examinations Summer 2017.

Excellent results. I am sure you are eager to see how our school has performed in the above public examinations.

We are extremely pleased that our results continue to repeat the excellent pattern which St. John's has set each year ever since the very first exams our pupils sat back in 1988.

The delay in letting you have these was for the usual reason – *appeals*. Each year, we find that some of the grades awarded do not make any sense and, as you would expect, the school lodges a series of appeals of which a significant number, I am pleased to say, are upheld.

A number of parents have asked why they cannot find St. John's in some of the 'league tables' which have occasionally appeared in certain newspapers over the last few months.

The *only* League Tables that matter are those published in **January** by the *Department of Education*, which are drawn up from the figures sent to them *directly* by the various examining boards. These tables are comprehensive and accurate. Any earlier league tables should be taken with a pinch of salt since they are compiled from figures either directly from the schools or from independent school associations who in turn collect their information from their school membership.

We are not part of these early performance tables because we do not belong to any association. We have not felt the need to do so. Rather than join an association, we prefer to rely on our results to speak for us. (School motto: **res ipsa loquitur** – “the thing speaks for itself”.)

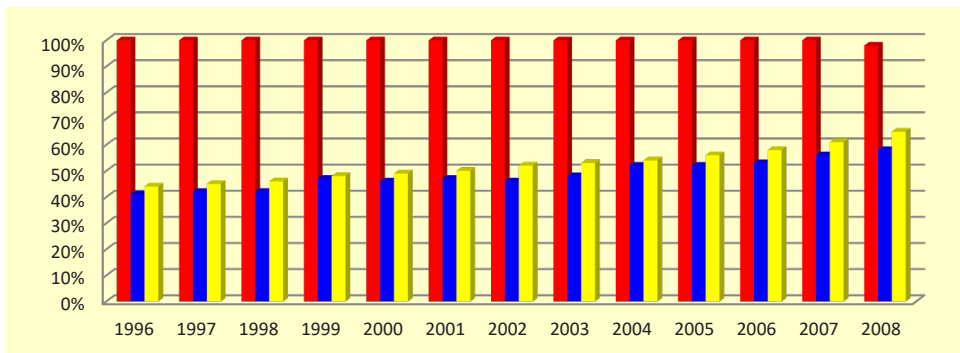

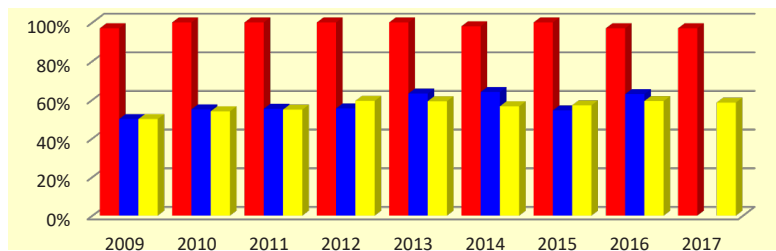

Nine things you should know about 9 to 1 GCSE grades

- 9 GCSEs in England are being reformed and will be graded with a new scale from 9 to 1, with 9 being the highest grade.
- 8 New GCSE content will be more challenging.
- 7 Fewer grade 9s will be awarded than A*s.
- 6 English language, English literature and maths will be the first to be graded from 9 to 1 in 2017.
- 5 Another 20 subjects will have 9 to 1 grading in 2018, with most others following in 2019. During this transition, students will receive a mixture of letter and number grades.
- 4 The new grades are being brought in to signal that GCSEs have been reformed and to better differentiate between students of different abilities.
- 3 In the first year each new GCSE subject is introduced, broadly the same proportion of students will get grades 1, 4 and 7 and above as would have got grades G, C and A and above respectively in the old system.
- 2 Regulators in Wales and Northern Ireland are not introducing the new 9 to 1 grading scale as part of the changes to GCSEs in their jurisdictions.
- 1 You can see how the 9 to 1 grades compare with the A* to G scale in the infographic on the right.

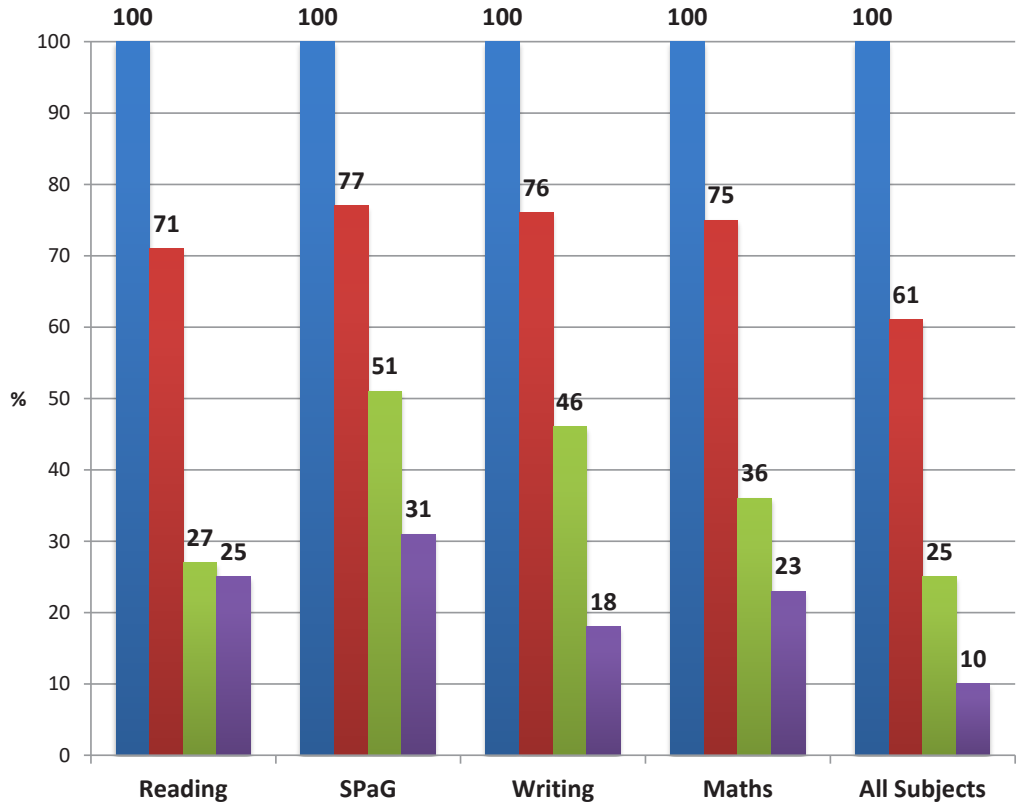
